



Principal's Last Address To Staff

1. Teaching as a career

From Primary to tertiary education my education has not been a smooth sailing journey. Like any other black child of my time education was characterised by lack of funds for better and higher education. After completing my form 5(Matric) I had no funds to continue with my tertiary. Fortunately for me my former principal at Mpambani Mzimba High School, where I matriculated offered me a teaching post in 1980(teaching with only form 5)

Towards the end of 1980 I applied at Fort Hare University, my home town University, but did not have registration fee the following year. Mrs. N.A. Makunje come to my rescue when She introduced me to people like Rev. Stofile, Charles Nqakula and others who had a scholarship for poor children like me. The scholarship paid for all my needs for the period of three years, and I was able to obtain my bachelor's degree. The following year the then Ciskei government offered, with the help of A.L. Matikinca(Business person and former teacher in my village), me a bursary to do University Education Diploma (Teaching Diploma) in 1985.

Mr. S.L. Njamela, the former principal of my school, who was then transferred to St. Matthews recruited me to join the school on the 25 January 1986. I thought History and at the same year introduced Geography as a new subject in Std. 10 at the school. I also taught the following subjects; English standard 6, isiXhosa Std. 10 and Religious Education in standard 6 and 7.

In 1989 I was appointed as a head of division (HOD) for Humanities. When our principal Mrs. N.C. Kekana died in 1991 I became an acting principal up to January 1992 when a new principal Ms. N. Mxotwa took over principalship. The same year 1992 with Ms. Mxothwa's arrival I was appointed as her Deputy Principal, the post I occupied for 14 years under her leadership. It is during this time that I developed as a manager and a leader. Her mentorship and love for the profession made me grow or develop in leadership skills. It is during her reign that I become confident of who I am and helped me know my strengths and weaknesses. Thank you to her for being part of my teaching career.
